About the COLLEGE

Manikpur Anchalik College, established on 2nd August 1993, was founded to fulfil the long-standing demand for higher education in the greater Manikpur region. The college serves a vast area comprising the entire Manikpur Police Station, parts of Sorbhog Police Station, to the west of the river Bhulukadoba (Pokalagi), and adjoining areas of Abhayapuri Police Station, with a population exceeding two lakh. The institution was conceived to address the educational needs of a predominantly economically and educationally disadvantaged community.

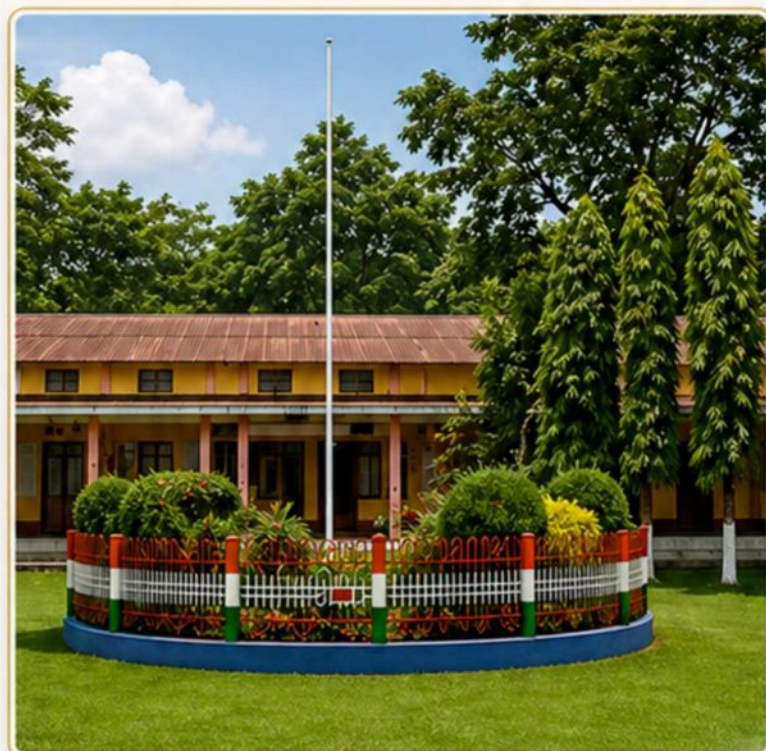
In its initial phase, the college operated from a semi-permanent facility at Govinda Bhavan Geeta Satra, Manikpur. Following the allotment of 40 bighas of land by the Government of Assam at Barbila V.G.R., the college shifted to its permanent campus on 2nd August 1995.

Late Ashwini Kumar Talukdar, former Vice-Principal of Barnagar College, Sorbhog, was the Founder Principal, and the then Deputy Commissioner of Bongaigaon served as the first President of the Governing Body.

Today, the college stands as the only institution of higher education in the greater Manikpur area.

With over 2,000 students enrolled, and supported by approximately 35 teaching and 15 non-teaching staff, the college continues to expand its academic reach.

It is affiliated with Gauhati University, follows the National Education Policy (NEP), and has been accredited with a 'B' grade by NAAC.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR BA COURSE

The applicants have to register themselves through the Samarth Admission Portal, After the completion of registration process, the applicants have to apply online to Samarth portal for admission into the B.A. programme in Manikpur Anchalik College under FYUGP of Gauhati University.

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Candidates intending to get admission in B.A. are required to pass H.S. or equivalent recognized examination.
2. Candidates for admission are selected strictly on merit basis only.
3. The college authority reserves the right to reject an application for admission if any discrepancies are found in their application.

Admission Requirements:

Candidates are required to produce the following documents at the time of admission :

- a) Marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
- b) H.S.L.C. Admit Card or Certificate as proof of age.
- c) Character Certificate / Testimonial certificate.
- d) Cast Certificate (for OBC, MOBC, SC, ST & EWS) only.
- e) Gap certificate (if necessary)
- f) Migration Certificate (if necessary)
- g) Passport size photo (two copies)
- h) Income Certificate from concerned authority (For Students seeking Free Admission)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR HS COURSE

Students who pass the HSLC (10th) examination from a recognized board / council are eligible for admission into the H.S. course. However, the admission of a student into this course is determined by the eligibility criteria laid down by ASSEB only.

For admission, students are selected strictly on the basis of merit. The admission procedure takes place immediately after the declaration of the H.S.L.C. / Class 10 result. Students selected for admission have to produce the following documents in original at the time of admission. Also the photo copies of those documents should be attached with the Application Form:

1. Pass Certificate and Mark sheet of H.S.L.C. Exam.
2. Admit Card of H.S.L.C. / Class 10 Exam.
3. Caste Certificate.
4. Gap Certificate, if necessary.
5. Migration Certificate, if necessary.
6. Certificate for sports, music, cultural activities etc.
(if selected under Sports/Cultural Quota)
7. Two unattested passport sized coloured photographs.

◆ **DARPAN for HS Admission**

The admission into the institution takes place through online mode. Students have to apply through “DARPAN” – the online admission portal of Assam State School Education Board (ASSEB) for admission into H.S. First Year Course. Applying for admission through online portal merely does not ensure the admission in to the institution. The selection list of the students for admission will be generated, as per the availability of the seats in the institution automatically on the basis of their merit. After selection process is over, students will have to fill in and submit a separate Admission Form of the institution and get their admission done thereafter. Students can obtain the Admission Form from the office of the college.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

- The decision of the college authority on all matters shall be final and binding.
- It is obligatory to each and every student to maintain 75% attendance in his/ her classes in each subject separately during the academic session calculated.
- Posting or uploading on social media (*Facebook, WhatsApp, Twitter, Instagram etc.*) of messages, photos, videos and any kind of materials which are *defamatory* to the college is strictly prohibited.
